- ✓ Provide documentation of successful completion of the BSA "Swimmer" Test.

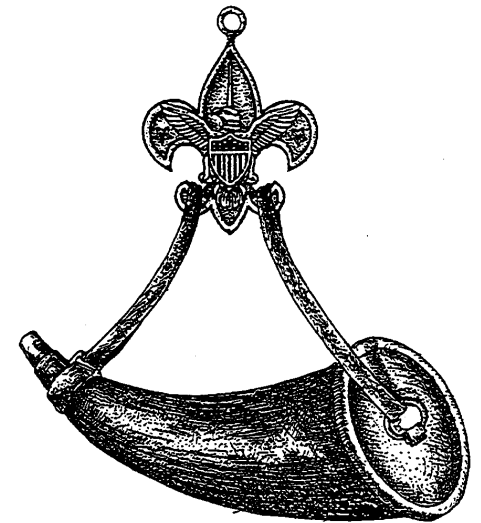
